

2. A measure for our sacrifice

- The measure is Christ's love for us.
- Christ's sacrifice for us was total and substitutionary.
- Total: He didn't tithe His blood.
- Substitutionary: Jesus' sacrifice was an exchange for us.
- C.S. Lewis was once asked "*How do you know you're giving enough?*"
 - "When it scares you".
 - "When people question your sanity".

3. The mission in our sacrifice

- a. The ministry of reconciliation.
- b. Reconciling the lost to God.
