

2. "I have to do everything!" (vs. 21-25)

*The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you," nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you."* (vs. 21)

None of us can do it all!

3. "I don't need anybody else." (vv. 25-26)

There are no "Lone Ranger Christians."

Spiritual gifts are unique ways the Holy Spirit shows up in the lives of believers.

The Holy Spirit immerses each person into the church as they become a believer, and that same Holy Spirit uniquely gifts each one to do ministry for the good of the body.

3 attitudes that keep us from playing our part in the body.

1. "I can't do anything!" (vs. 15-20)

*For we (all of us) are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.*

The Greek word translated workmanship is poiema.

Every part of the body is important!

When God blesses what you are doing that is a sign that you are honoring God with your Spiritual gift.
