- The Hebrew word translated helper is Ezer Kenegdo
- Ezer – A strong life saving help.
- Kenegdo – opposite, in front of or corresponding to. Equivalent in character form or function.

Satan hates God and he hates mankind created in His image and so his goal from the beginning is to destroy what God has created.

He attacks God’s pattern by going to the woman first and not the man.

“then the Lord God formed the man of dust from the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living creature.” – Genesis 2:7

- God is establishing Adam’s headship. He is defining Adam’s role and its importance.
